



What is TriVisc?

Trivisc helps supplement the viscous properties of the fluid in your knee joint.

TriVisc is from a class of products known as hyaluronic acid, sodium hyaluronate, or hyaluronan (HA), and is also known as viscosupplementation therapy. It is approved for treatment of pain due to osteoarthritis of the knee in patients who do not get adequate relief from simple painkillers like acetaminophen or from exercise and physical therapy.²

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

Knee pain caused by osteoarthritis (OA) is suffered by millions of people. It's your pain we care about. Relieving your knee pain means getting back to your life.¹



How does TriVisc work?

The precise mechanism by which TriVisc works is unknown. The fluid (synovial fluid) in your knee helps to lubricate and cushion the joint during movement. The major component in the synovial fluid is hyaluronic acid, the same active component of TriVisc. One of the early effects of osteoarthritis is to break down the fluid, making it less effective. It is thought that TriVisc injections helps restore the synovial fluid to a healthier state, thereby reducing the pain of OA.²

How is TriVisc administered?

TriVisc is administered by intra-articular injection. Intra-articular means your healthcare professional will insert a needle into the space in your knee joint that contains fluid used for lubrication and cushioning.²

How many injections should I receive?

Clinical investigations with TriVisc have demonstrated that three injections one week apart provide optimal pain relief. The effectiveness of less than three injections has not been evaluated. You should discuss this with your doctor. Completion of the full injection treatment course is recommended to achieve the greatest therapeutic benefit.²

When can I expect pain relief?

Each patient's response to TriVisc may vary depending on the severity of your OA, degree of pain, and pre-existing medical conditions. In some patients, successful treatment may reduce pain within the first week after treatment begins. However, based upon clinical trials, most patients experience pain relief after their third injection of TriVisc.²



Will my insurance cover HA injections?

Most insurance carriers and Medicare cover viscosupplementation therapy. The process of obtaining reimbursement varies from plan to plan, so talk with your doctor's office and your insurance provider before you begin treatment to determine coverage.²

Can I purchase TriVisc directly from a pharmacy?

If your plan does not cover Hyaluronic Acid Injections, or you choose not to use insurance to pay for the treatment, TriVisc is available with a prescription for purchase directly from our pharmacy partner network at a significant cost savings. It would then ship to your physician, who would administer the injection. FSA/HSA eligible.²

How safe is TriVisc?

TriVisc was approved for use in the United States in 2017. TriVisc has a demonstrated safety profile, with over 35 million doses administered worldwide since its first approval, and has been studied in over 30 clinical trials for use in relieving osteoarthritis knee pain in patients who are unresponsive to non-pharmacologic therapy and simple analgesics.²

What should I do after my treatments?

It is recommended that you avoid strenuous activities such as jogging, tennis, and heavy lifting for at least 48 hours after receiving an injection. Your healthcare provider will advise you about the level of activity that is right for you. Patients are often able to maintain their normal daily activities after receiving TriVisc treatment.²

Can I take other medications with TriVisc?

Since TriVisc is injected directly into the joint rather than administered systemically and there are no known drug interactions, you may be able to take other medications with it. TriVisc is not known to interfere with other pain relievers and anti-inflammatory drugs. The safety and effectiveness of the use of Trivisc at the same time as other intra-articular injections, such as steroids, has not been established. Since it is administered locally, it is unlikely that you will observe any benefit in joints not specifically injected. You should discuss all of your current medications and vitamin supplements with your physician on a periodic basis.²

Are there any reasons why I should not receive TriVisc?

Avoid this product if you have a known hypersensitivity (allergy) to TriVisc or HA products such as rash, itching, hives, flushing, swelling of the face, tongue or throat, and/or difficulty breathing.

Avoid in people with infections or skin diseases in the area of the injection site.²

What are the possible side effects?

Some side effects may occur during the use of TriVisc, with symptoms such as knee pain, inflammation, reddening, swelling appearing at the injection site and/or joint pain. Tell your healthcare provider if you experience any side effects after treatment of TriVisc.²

How do I know if TriVisc is right for me?

Your healthcare provider is the best person to advise you on any course of treatment. TriVisc is approved for the treatment of knee pain due to osteoarthritis of the knee in patients who do not get enough relief from simple over the counter pain medication or from exercise and physical therapy.²
